Facilities

The PPCC Hall has of 3276 sq ft. including the main meeting room, warming kitchen, and rest rooms. The main meeting room is approximately 76 ft. x 30 ft with hardwood floors. Ceiling height is 9.5 ft. but heating equipment on the ceiling has only a 7 ft. clearance in the center of the room. The building has been upgraded to ADA standards (ramp at back).

The club has chairs and folding tables to accommodate 80 people for meals or more for meetings and presentations. Maximum capacity is about 130.

Renting the PPCC Hall

We try to keep our rental rates as low as possible but we have to cover expenses for utilities, insurance and cleaning.

Our rental rate is a flat \$25 per hour.

Please remember to allow time for set-up and tear-down. You need to leave the facility clean for the next user. If you arrange tables and chairs you are expected to return them to their normal storage location at the east end of the main room. Please be mindful of the wood floors, do not drag tables and chairs on the floor. If necessary, sweep the floor. You are not permitted to move items attached to the walls. Special arrangements can be accommodated, be sure to ask.

We do not permit smoking nor alcoholic beverages on the premises.

History

The PPCC was formed in 1928 to serve as a community support and social organization. Land for the club facility was deeded to the club and the original building was erected in 1932.

The original facility burned in 1952 and the current building was erected in 1955. This building was expanded in 1962 to include a garage for the volunteer fire department equipment and was later used by Teller County Search and Rescue.

Local residents, mostly ranchers, held Saturday night dances and pot-luck dinners, fund raiser events for families in need and other community support activities.



Organization

The PPCC meets quarterly on the second Thursday of the first month of the Quarter (Jan, Apr, July, Oct). We begin with a pot-luck supper at 6:30 pm followed by the business meeting starting at 7:00 PM. Visitors are welcome.

The PPCC is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization chartered to support the community.

Annual dues are \$10.00 per family which includes children under 19 years old. New members are welcome and encouraged.
